1992 self-titled debut album. It was released as The album's lead single in November 1992. "Killing in the Name" was originally released as part of a 12-song self-released cassette. Tom Morello wrote the guitar riffs while teaching a student drop D tuning; he briefly paused the lesson to record the riff. The band worked on the song the next day. The song title speaks for itself. The song became relevant again because of the protests in the United States over the murder of Georg Floydi. The band's first video for "Killing in the Name" did not receive large airplay in the United States due to the explicit lyrics. The song received substantial airplay in Europe and boosted the band's popularity outside of their borne country.
